### A Letter from Board Member Vicki Randolph

Cama'i (Hello) to you! Thank you for taking time to read this month's Chatter! My name is Vicki Randolph. I am a life-long, 6th generation Alaskan kid born and raised on the island of Kodiak. My mother's bloodline is Alutiiq (AK Native) and Norwegian. My father's ancestors emigrated from England to the region now known as Virginia in the late 1600's. A career move brought me to Wasilla in June 1991, and I knew within 3 days of arriving that I wanted to live in Palmer; I moved to Palmer 2 months later. I became a consignee with my jewelry (Classy Glass Expressions) in the fabulous MSSS Gift Shop in 2014. I have 2 grown children and a playful Goldendoodle puppy dog, but no grandkids. I love God, nature, all creatures with paws, challenging and exercising my brain with logic puzzles, and feeding the creative side of my brain with a variety of artistic interests.

I worked 35 years in the world of finance with most of that time spent in mortgage lending. After retiring from a career I loved, my days are now filled with play time with my dog, managing my jewelry making business, working on a novel, being active with Palmer Toastmasters, coaching a speech club and mentoring high school students in speech competition for the IDEA homeschool program, and volunteering each week at Frontline Mission. As a young girl I was inspired by my mother's volunteerism activities in our community—she was the volunteer secretary for several local service organizations, she volunteered at the museum each week, and was a regular usher for performing arts events. Mom was a precinct worker in every election, and she helped save countless lives as a lifelong blood donor.
