A Letter from Board Member Dora Wheeler



In the September issue of our newsletter, Board of Director of current time, Tom Schulman, commented on several important categories. The center is an excellent place of socializing for a number of us. The activities a seniors can participate in, which are several, include exercise programs, painting, book club, bingo, commodities, sewing, knitting group, and more. As well as the call for much needed volunteers and board of director positions. And, of course, budget constraints everywhere! I as a board member want to say – we all enjoy and need your participation, this is what makes our Palmer Senior Citizen Center. Thank you!

I want to change the subject, since we all notice the temperature dropping, especially in the mornings. I'm glad the season of fishing, camping, hunting, gardening and harvesting are over with. It gives me more time with the senior center, in my sewing room and/or cooking up something tasteful as Beef (Moose Meat) Barley Soup. Here's the recipe from my kitchen to you!

Beef (Moose Meat)Barley Soup Slow Cooker (low) 6 hours or Stove top 1 hour. Serves 6

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 lb or less cubed beef or moose meat.
- (if using beef stew meat, cut into smaller chunks)
- ½ cup chopped onion
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- 1 tsp salt
- ½ tsp pepper
- 3 cups water

- 2 (10.5 oz) cans beef broth or add
 - 2 ½ cups water and 3 beef bouillon or
 2 1/2 tsp beef better than bouillon
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 cup diced carrots
- 1 cup chopped celery with leaves
- 1 cup pearled barley or follow instructions for quick cooking barley
- ¼ cup parsley
- 1 cup sliced or diced mushrooms

Heat oil in skillet or pot over medium heat, add meat and sauté until browned. Add onions, garlic powder, salt and pepper, if using slow cooker transfer this mixture to the cooker. Add a bit of water to skillet and stir up remaining browned onions and seasonings, then pour over the meat in the cooker.

Add in the rest of the water, beef broth, bay leaf, carrots, celery, pearled barley, parsley, and mushrooms. If making this on the stove top bring to full boil 2-3 minutes than simmer 15 minutes, add water as needed. If preparing in the crock pot, cover and set to low for 6 hours.

Freezes well.

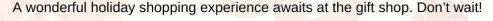
